## TEACHER'S GUIDE

### **Instructions:**

Take each question one by one and have the students write down their answer, then discuss the question with the entire group.

### **Observations:**

- Question #1      Try to make this passage as easy to understand as possible. Ask your students if they believe what it says – that their lives will be better if they obey and honor their parents.
- Question #2      The goal here is for honesty. Are they really doing what this verse says on a daily basis? If not, do they truly believe what it says.
- Question #3      Take these questions one by one. Have the students answer, then discuss each one together. Be sure to tie each question back to the passage. Show how honor and respect for parents should impact our actions in each case. Again, the goal is to help the students evaluate whether or not they are truly doing what Paul tells them to do.
